Carleton Varney is associated with the restoration and decoration of countless hotels and resorts all over the world. Formerly the design consultant for the Carter Presidential Library, he also restored and redecorated many diplomatic homes, including the Official Vice President's Residence. His versatility can be seen in the wide range of products that have borne his mark, from furniture, to lamps, dinnerware, crystal and linens. His fabric designs grace the private residences of his impressive roster of clients, including superstars from the worlds of entertainment (Joan Crawford, Van Johnson, Jimmy Nederlander), politics (Presidents Carter and Bush), royalty (Princess Yasmin Aga Khan), and business (Rockefeller). Carleton Varney's design philosophy stresses bright colors and the rejection of all that is impractical, uncomfortable, and drab. He continues the tradition of Dorothy Draper with his imaginative use of vibrant colors, floral patterns, and bold contrasts.

Optional Prelude: County Cork

July 19 - 22

Experience tranquility at a picturesque Georgian Country Hotel, Longueville House, located on 500 acres of wooded land. Optional activities include private fly fishing, falconry, equestrian, biking & hiking, and tours of the distillery, famed for its cider and Apple brandy. Finish your stay with a class at the Ballymaloe Cookery School, set in the picturesque Irish countryside.

Adare Village and County Limerick July 21 – 24

Enjoy intimate, insider visits at the private homes of distinguished local residents, including a tour of George and Michelina Stacpoole's garden and home and dinner with Lady Dunraven at her private residence. Experience Churchill House, built in the mid-18th century for the Denny family. Not open to the public, the residence is considered a 'total work of art', comprised of architecture, landscape design, interiors and one of the largest private collections of Irish art including masterpieces by Jack Butler Yeats, Paul Henry and Thomas Roberts. Our stay in county Limerick will culminate with a visit to Carleton Varnev's country estate, Shannongrove House, where you will enjoy an evening of drinks, dinner, and entertainment.

Ballyfin and the Midlands

July 25 - 26

Escape to Ballyfin, the 200-year old neoclassical house that has been restored to it's original, resplendent condition. Each room is opulently furnished and decorated with Irish art and antiques from around the world. Set at the foot of the Slieve Bloom Mountains, with stone walls enclosing the parkland, the landscape is among the finest examples in Ireland of the natural style of gardening. Highlights include ancient woods, walled gardens, follies, and grottos. Spend a day at Birr Castle as a guest of Lord and Lady Rosse with a private tour of the exquisite rooms and picturesque gardens, and enjoy a lunch of local fare in the rich red dining room.
